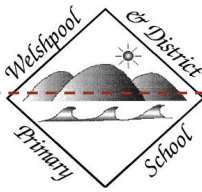
### COMPASS ATTENDANCE SIGN IN/OUT

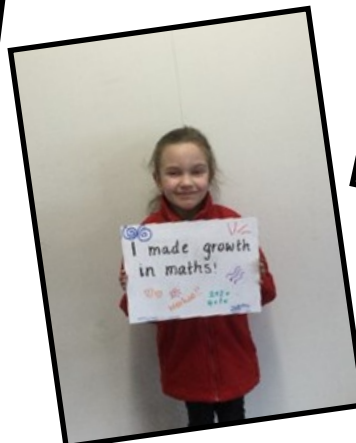
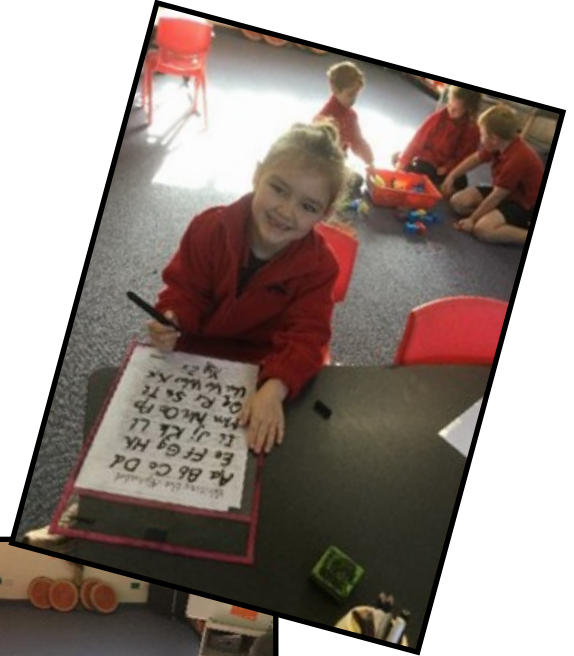


## GRADE Prep & 1

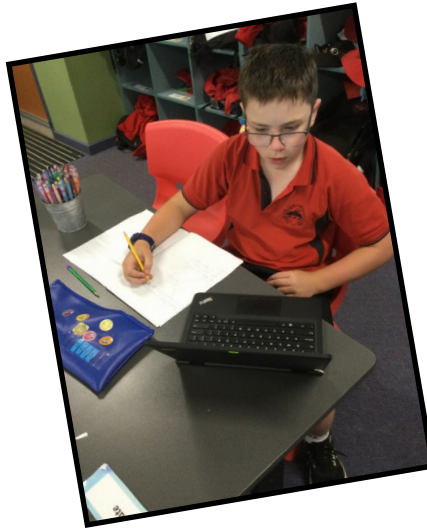
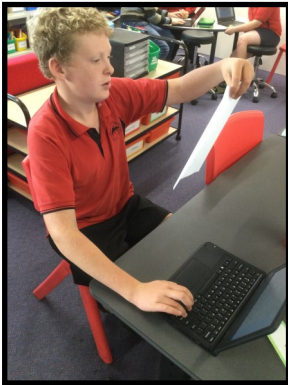
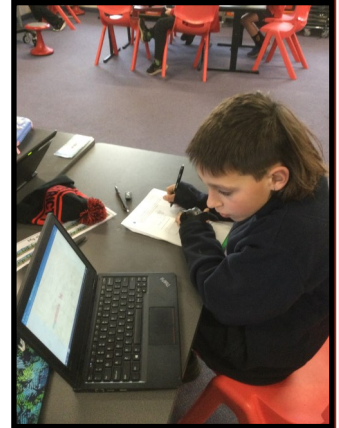
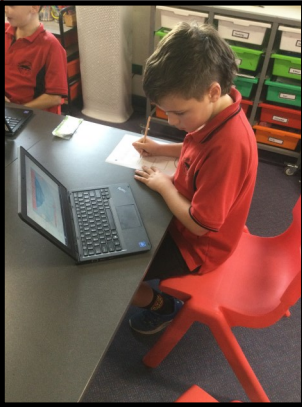
## GRADE 4, 5 & 6

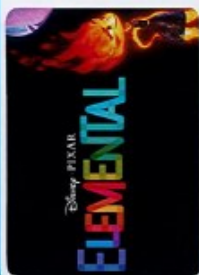

### Preview of Learning - Term 2 2023



We are very pleased with our new MARC Library base at Fish Creek and District Primary School and now feel settled and when we step inside the library we look around with pride. So many wonderful books, focussed user friendly organization and welcome. But what do others see?

Watching children walk in one sees reverence of a new and inviting place, curiosity and a sense of what will I find? They are drawn in, their eyes looking, their bodies turning and then...that is the moment when they see books that they want to look at, browse, hold and read. Although not all the children we teach are able to use the MARC Library at Fish Creek, we also see that same delight when students enter the van when it is at their school. It is an exciting experience. No doubt you as parents 'see', the above described, when you take your children to local libraries in our area. Choosing a new book supports reading and reading supports learning and living.

Below is a preview of our program for Term 2 2023.

Week	TOPIC
1	All students were read ANZAC stories which shared the meaning of ANZAC and the bravery and sacrifices made during wartime.
2-4	Students delved into the genre of adventure. The common features were discussed and noted in a variety of texts. Younger students enjoyed 'Cannonball Simp' by John Burningham and 'Mr. Penguin and the Lost Treasure' by Alex T Smith.
5	All students will share looked forward to, newly published literature.
6	To coincide with National Reconciliation week, this week we read books written by First Nation authors.
7	Joke books are regularly borrowed and all students should enjoy the opportunity to learn how jokes work, hear jokes and record jokes to 'tell' others.
8	Illustrative techniques enhance the 'telling of a story'. This week techniques used by Herve Tullot will be explored.
9	We will complete our learning for the term with new literature.

The Plan will concentrate upon children aged up to 12 years and their families, and they will develop the Plan in partnership with service providers and our community. I have stepped onto the steering group as a representative and voice of our community and school to help develop the Municipal Early Years Plan (MEYP) for South Gippsland.

The Municipal Early Years Plan will focus on and include children and families from birth to 12 years of age and foster a whole-of-community, whole-of-systems approach to build community capacity and capability. It will aim to address the underlying causes of inequity and vulnerability of children and families and focus on prevention, equity, health, and long-term social and educational outcomes for children.

At school students have been working through their ideas of what they would like to see in our community. We are asking families to have they say too.
