Welcome to 2024

We would like to warmly welcome our new families and welcome back our returning families to what we hope is another fantastic year of learning and friendship. We hope you all managed to find time to relax and unwind over the Christmas break. The students have settled back in beautifully. The playground is full of happy, smiling faces and in the classrooms the students are undertaking start of year assessments.

A reminder that we use Compass as a means of communication at WDPS. If you are having any problems with Compass, please let us know and we will assist you. New families should have received their log in details. If not, please see the office. Currently on Compass, families can book Parent/Teacher interviews. We have set down Monday 4th March and Tuesday 5th March for these interviews. If you are unable to book a time and would like an interview, please contact your child's classroom teacher and they will be able to book you in.

At WDPS we have students who have a peanut allergy. Their reaction to peanuts requires them to have an EpiPen. Anaphylaxis is a life-threatening condition but can be managed by reducing or limiting the risk to known allergens. We can help these students and their families transition safely to school by reducing peanut exposure. Please refrain from bring peanuts and/or peanut based foods (e.g., peanut butter sandwiches) to school. If you require further information, please contact me.





<u>Did you know that Welshpool and District</u> <u>PS is on the Bushfire Category 4 list?</u>

Did you know that Welshpool and District PS is on the Bushfire Category 4 list?

Our school has been identified as being at risk of bushfire or grassfire and will close on a day forecasted as catastrophic fire danger rating in West and South Gippsland fire district.

Attached to this newsletter is more information about what happens on these days and how families will be notified. Please read over the information and make yourself aware of the processes around this.

School preparations for the bushfire season

Each year, to prepare for bushfifres and grassfires, schools and early childhood services complete a range of activities.

The Department of Education runs an annual fire risk assessment of schools and early childhood services. They are allocated a category of risk (categories 0 to 4) and are published on the Bushfire At-Risk Register (BARR).



All schools and early childhood services listed on the BARR and Category 4 list will also close when a Catastrophic fire danger rating day is forecast in their fire weather district.

When the Bureau of Meteorology provides public fire danger rating forecasts or fire weather warnings, they use fire weather district areas. In Victoria, there are 9 fire weather districts, which are based on Local Government Area boundaries. Our school is in the West and South Gippsland fire weather district.

As part of preparing our school for the fire season, we have updated and completed our Emergency Management Plan and completed a School Bushfire Site Readiness Review Checklist.

What does this mean for our school?

Our school has been identified as being at risk of bushfire or grassfire and is a Category 4 school.

Our school will close on a day forecasted as Catastrophic fire danger rating in West and South Gippsland fire district.

What is the department's policy?

The department's <u>Bushfire and Grassfire Preparedness Policy</u> requires all schools and early childhood services on the BARR and the Category 4 list to close when a Catastrophic fire danger rating day is forecast in their fire weather district. All school bus routes which travel in or through a district with Catastrophic fire danger must also be cancelled.

When will our school be closed due to Catastrophic fire danger?

Our school will close on a day forecasted as Catastrophic fire danger rating in West and South Gippsland fire weather district.

Closure of the school due to a forecast Catastrophic day will be confirmed on the day prior and we will provide you with advice before the end of the school day. Any information regarding potential or confirmed Catastrophic fire danger days will be communicated to you by **Compass**, which is the school's main means of communication. Letters may also be sent home with students.

Once confirmed, the decision to close will not change, even if the weather forecast changes. This is to avoid confusion and help your family plan alternative care arrangements for your child. It is also important to be aware that:

- No one will be on site on days where the school is closed due to a forecast Catastrophic day
- Out-of-school-hours care will also be cancelled on these days.
- All bus routes that travel through the Catastrophic area will be cancelled.
- School camps will be cancelled if a Catastrophic fire danger rating day is forecast for fire
 weather district in which the camp is located, or if the travel involves passing through areas
 that have Catastrophic fire danger.

Families are encouraged to action their Bushfire Survival Plan on Catastrophic fire danger rating days. On such days, children should never be left at home alone or in the care of older children.

For those of us living in a bushfire prone area, the Country Fire Authority (CFA) advises that when Catastrophic days are forecast, the safest option is to leave the night before or early on the morning of the Catastrophic day.

What can families and the school community do to help us prepare?

- Ensure we have your current contact details, including your mobile phone numbers.
- Keep in touch with us through Compass, by reading our newsletters and checking our website http://www.welshpoolps.vic.edu.au/. Please contact the school if you have any questions or concerns about our emergency procedures.
 - Make sure your family's bushfire survival plan is up-to-date and includes alternative care
 arrangements in the event that our school is closed due to a Catastrophic fire danger. Further
 information can be found on the <u>CFA's website</u>.
- Action your family's bushfire survival plan if your own triggers are met. Our school community
 may be spread out across many areas and some families may be at higher risk than others.
 Your family's safety is critical, so please let us know if you are actioning your bushfire survival
 plan and if your children will be absent on these days.
- If your child is old enough, talk to them about bushfires and your family's bushfire survival
 plan.
