Child Safety Standards

What to Expect at Welshpool and District Primary School

- Everyone connected to our school can help children be safe
 - We have a **zero tolerance for any abuse to children**
 - We have policies and process in place to protect the care. Safety and welfare of children
 - The Child Safety Standards go further than child protection arrangements did in the past
 - The Child Safety Standards apply to all school staff, volunteers, contractors, visitors and student family members
 - Keeping children safe is everyone's responsibility
 - We want to ensure you know how we are keeping the students safe at school, and how we'd like you to support us.
 - Unsupervised contractors will be asked for a current Working With Children Check if they are at school during school hours (8:30am—3:30pm)
 - All volunteers need to have a current Working With Children Check .
 - All people who attend the school (other than parent pick up and drop off) will be required to sign in.
- In line with our child safe processes, if parent/guardian/family member/friend/etc picks up a student early from school, they **MUST** sign student out on Ipad at the office, and verbal/email consent provided.

REMINDER TO PARENTS, WHEN ENTERING ABSCENCES ON COMPASS .

If a student is **absent** from school, please ensure you make the appropriate entry on Compass with the relevant code applicable. Unexplained absences must be identified. If you choose 'parent choice,' please explain why, so we can re-code if necessary.

If a student is **late**, parents must sign them in on the Ipad in the office and hand the printed slip to the classroom teacher or office admin, for role marking.

If leaving early, the student must be signed out and slip handed to classroom teacher.

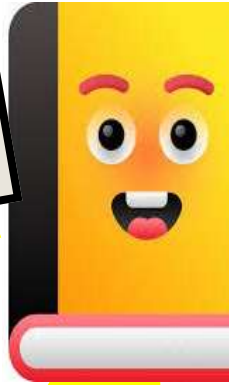

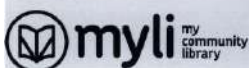
Songs, rhymes, stories and play @ Welshpool Primary School

P/1 Classroom



This week in the P/1 classroom students have been learning all about patterns in maths. Students have been exploring how to create repeating patterns with colours, shapes and numbers. Patterns have been fun to explore, students have been taking notice of patterns throughout other classes too, "Hey that's a pattern!". This week was also the beginning of whole school maths, this term we are focusing on counting. Students have spent week 4 getting to know the structure and routine of whole school maths again, next week we dive straight into our explicit lessons.

Throughout our literacy block we have started to work in our sounds-write groups. Group 1 have been working on unit 1 initial code sounds (a, i, m, s, t), Group 2 have been revising code 11 (sh, ch, th, ng, ck). In writing students have been focusing on letter recognition and formation.

Readers went home with students this week; it has been great to see lots of students practising their reading at home. Keep up the great work P/1!

2/3 Classroom



The grade 2/3 class have had a good, energetic and busy start back to the 2025 school year. The Grade 3's demonstrating their classroom values and agreements to the Grade 2's, and all students helping Miss Matthews learn the ways of Welshpool and District Primary School.

We have made a start on our NAPLAN preparation in Reading, where students have worked as a class and in small groups to answer questions about different texts.

Our Sounds-Write program has also been reintroduced to students this week - focusing on different ways to spell the /e/ sound.

During writing we have been exploring aspects of recount writing. The students have been practicing ordering events and including past tense. We have had many opportunities to practice recount writing about our holidays, weekends, and even swimming week.

Patterns have been our focus during maths, with students identifying patterns around our classroom and making new patterns from our math resources.

4/5/6 Classroom



Over the last fortnight, the students in 4/5/6 have continued to settle into the classroom well. We have been working as a team, sharing our learning in pairs, small groups and as a whole class. We have been reading to partners, practicing reading with fluency and being good listeners. Students have also started taking part in their daily reading rotations in their groups, either independently or with support from Jaimee, Sofie or myself.

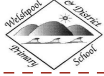
We have begun some NAPLAN preparation, with students writing convincing persuasive texts on the topic 'Living in the country is better than living in the city'. We have also been spending time learning strategies for reading, understanding and answering NAPLAN questions.

In maths, we have collected lots of data and made various representations, such as pie charts, bar graphs and frequency tables. We spent time interpreting these data representations and learnt what the 'mode' is and how to find it. We will continue reviewing NAPLAN questions and start our new focus for Maths on decimals.

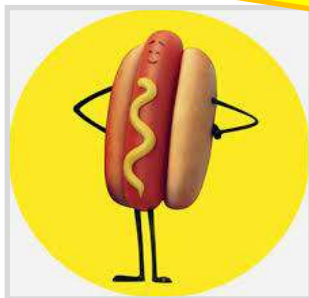

ONE PAGE OVERVIEW



FREE INSTRUCTION

- Schools provide students with free instruction and ensure students have free access to all items, activities and services that are used by the school to fulfil requirements of the Curriculum. This includes the Victorian Curriculum F-10, The Victorian Certificate of Education (VCE) including the VCE Vocational Major and Victorian Pathways Certificate.
- Schools may invite parents to make a financial contribution to support the school.



PARENT PAYMENT REQUESTS

Schools can request contributions from parents under three categories:

Curriculum Contributions

Voluntary financial contributions for curriculum items and activities which the school deems necessary for students to learn the Curriculum.

Other Contributions

Voluntary financial contributions for non-curriculum items and activities that relate to the school's functions and objectives.

Extra-Curricular Items and Activities

Items and activities that enhance or broaden the schooling experience of students and are above and beyond what the school provides for free to deliver the Curriculum. These are provided on a user-pays basis.

- Schools may also invite parents to supply or purchase educational items to use and own (e.g. textbooks, stationery, digital devices).



FINANCIAL HELP FOR FAMILIES

- Schools put in place financial hardship arrangements to support families who cannot pay for items or activities so that their child doesn't miss out.
- Schools have a nominated parent payment contact person(s) that parents can have a confidential discussion with regarding financial hardship arrangements.



SCHOOL PROCESSES

- Schools must obtain school council approval for their parent payment arrangements and publish all requests and communications for each year level on their school website for transparency.
